## THE SHIPWRIGHTS WAY

The Shipwrights Way is planned to be a multi user route for walkers, cyclists, and where possible, horse riders and wheelchair users.

Two routes had been prepared, one that could be easily and quickly implemented and a longer term 'aspirational' route that would require more major work, over a period of up to around five years.

One of the key considerations of the route had been the amenity of users, with regard to the visual amenity of the users' surroundings, noise levels, and the surface on which they would be walking.

The event in Rowlands Castle celebrated Armed Forces Day on Saturday June 26<sup>th</sup> 2010, with a beautiful turnout on the village green. Attending were a contingency of the Royal British Legion, who were all-smiles in the balmy weather and who looked the part with impeccable dress and well-shined medals glinting in the sunlight.

Cllr Chick, Vice-Chairman of East Hampshire District Council, remembered a local man who became the 300th British soldier to be killed in Afghanistan:

"This year, Armed Forces Day takes on a special poignancy as we remember Marine Richard Hollington from our district, killed recently in Afghanistan in the line of duty. We pay tribute to his memory, just as we do to the memory of all those who have given so much."

Kath Molloy, who patrols at St John's Church of England Primary School in Rowlands Castle, has been voted East Hampshire's favourite lollipop person of the year.
