## October '11 Round up



### Rural Crime

The main theme for the meeting was rural crime and Karen Dawes, Community Safety Manager introduced the Forum to a new website called Crime Reports ([www.crimereports.co.uk](http://www.crimereports.co.uk)) which enabled people to see what crimes had occurred in their area.

PCSO Mel Rowell introduced 'Countrywatch', which was a county-wide initiative in Hampshire to tackle crime in rural areas. The types of crimes that Country Watch focused on included theft, poaching, anti-social behaviour on land, fly tipping and wildlife crime.

She explained that it was free to become a member of Country Watch and members received text alerts about crime in their area, as well as a monthly email update.

Fire Fighter Simon Mills Risk Reduction Officer for East Hampshire addressed the Forum. East Hampshire was the first rural part of the County to have a dedicated Risk Reduction Officer and the initiative sought to bring to rural areas what already existed in urban areas.

The Forum worked in area based groups to identify locations on maps where they had reason to believe that illegal activities were occurring.

This information was collated by the Community Safety Manager and forwarded to the relevant authorities.

## Have your say on police budgets in online survey



Hampshire Police Authority has launched an online survey to give the public the power to influence the policing budget for 2012/13.

Residents from Hampshire and the Isle of Wight are being encouraged to share their views and opinions on the allocation of the policing budget and their policing priorities.

Councillor Jacqui Rayment, Chair of Hampshire Police Authority, said: "The Authority has always been led by the views and opinions of the residents of Hampshire and the Isle of Wight.

"The results of the survey will be used to help shape the future policing services for Hampshire and the Isle of Wight and we welcome your views."

The survey, which can be done anonymously, asks questions about how safe people feel, whether they have been the victim of crime, and gives the opportunity to say whether Hampshire Constabulary should be spending more or less money in key budget areas.
