Alton station forecourt improvements steam ahead

Improvement work to enhance Alton's train station forecourt is nearing completion and is on track for April.

The jointly funded £1M scheme will see the well-used parking and drop-off area at Station Road in Alton transformed into a fresh, attractive and accessible gateway to the town, with easier access for vehicles, pedestrians and cyclists.

The pavement, which runs from Anstey Road junction along Station Road will also benefit from resurfacing work along with improved drainage, hydroplanting and new parking control measures.



ESSENTIAL ROUTINE MAINTENANCE BROUGHT FORWARD

At the beginning of March, contractors for station car park owners Network Rail, will start additional planned works to the car park tarmac ahead of Walkers Construction undertaking the final surfacing works. This routine work has been brought forward to fit-in with the overall forecourt improvement scheme.

Having two contractors on site isn't practical, so Walkers are stepping back for around six weeks before returning to complete the project.

Network Rail's contractors will meet with surrounding residents and businesses to explain what is happening.

PROGRESS SO FAR

Work commenced on-site in mid August 2022

- Footway from Paper Mill Lane to Station main entrance reopened
- Pavements and car parking area around Station Cafe and Waitrose completed
- Removing of damaged sycamores and new planting has begun

Next steps:

- Main car park to be repaired and resurfaced
- Progress options for Station Road design
- Planters and bollards to stop vehicles blocking the pavement












OUR AIM
