## Petersfield Museum

Petersfield Museum were awarded the grant to contribute to the delivery of a community creative and cultural engagement programme. In total 76 workshops which range from archaeological digs on Petersfield Heath to craft groups have attracted 570 participants, many of them pupils from local schools.

By having a strong programme of events and activities the museum is able to better connect with people in East Hampshire. This encourages residents to return to visit the museum and its café and shop. As such the museum is more resilient to change by having developed regular visitors.

## Whitehill Royal Voluntary Service Lunch Club

**The lunch club use funding to help provide a freshly cooked, two-course lunch every Thursday between 12pm-2.30pm at Whitehill Village Hall.**

For those needing transport from home, they are using the funding awarded to offer travel at a subsidised cost of £2 per day ensuring no one is left out. In December 2022, model Jodie Kidd volunteered for the day, driving people to and from the lunch club.

The club have started working with Social Prescribers, so they are able to take referrals from those who may be isolated and greatly benefit from attending the lunch club.

In June 2023, Carol Anne Dann, the branch co-ordinator was recognised by the King and Queen as one of the nation's coronation champions!

# Alton Methodist Church

**Alton Methodist Church were awarded the grant to contribute towards the Anna Chaplain role. The Anna Chaplain seeks to reduce social isolation by visiting older people in care homes, or in their own homes.**

Since the grant started in September 2022 the Anna Chaplaincy team has grown into a volunteer base of 18 people. They give their time to support at events and have trained to do 1-1 visits, enabling the number of people being reached to increase.

People are also being signposted to other organisations which can offer specialist support such as Dementia Friendly groups.

The Anna Chaplaincy Team has also hosted three successful events to which people are invited to take part in. They include crafts, hand massages, afternoon tea and sing-alongs. These events have proven popular and well attended so plans are underway for another Christmas event.
