Bramshott and Liphook Neighbourhood Plan Consultation

Thank you for consulting Surrey County Council (SCC) on the Bramshott and Liphook Neighbourhood Plan. This is an officer response and we have one comment to make reflecting the council's role as the responsible authority for Surrey for education.

Education Issues

We note that paragraph 8.19 and policy BL18 indicate concern that school provision needs to meet demand as the population continues to grow.

Any proposed development in Bramshott and Liphook is likely to impact on secondary schools in the areas which border Surrey. Our current secondary school sites in Haslemere and neighbouring areas have limited or no ability to expand. Hampshire County Council, as the Local Education Authority, is best placed to comment on any need for additional school places and we would welcome further discussion with officers as the plan develops. Education Place Planning will continue to work with Hampshire County Council and local borough and district councils to ensure there are sufficient school places for any additional pupil yield from housing.
